Dear Resident

Enfield Council has £30 million from Transport for London to transform the way we move around our Borough. This programme, called Cycle Enfield, will improve many of the borough's high streets and town centres, making them great places to live, work and travel around. Our proposals aim to improve safety and encourage more people to walk and cycle. As we increase the number of people who make local journeys this way, we will relieve congestion, improve air quality and help support the local economy.

A key part of this programme are proposals to re-design the road space along the A105, from Palmers Green to Enfield Town.

Benefits of Cycle Enfield

We believe that the proposals for the A105 will generate the following benefits:

- Improved and safer roads for everyone, however they choose to travel
- Improved facilities will encourage more people to walk and cycle
- Improved public realm will encourage people to spend more time and money in town centres along the route and new public spaces will create more opportunities for local businesses and community events.
- Creation of a calmer traffic corridor through this part of the community will enhance the area as a place to live.

These events will provide an opportunity to discuss the Cycle Enfield proposals. The exhibition will also enable you to see exactly how the scheme will look in the area where you live and along the entire route from Palmers Green to Enfield Town.

How can I have my say?

This exhibition will mark the start of the consultation process for the A105 scheme, which will last for 12 weeks. This will provide all members of the community with the opportunity to have their say on the proposals. More details on the consultation process are in the enclosed A5 leaflet.

What happens after the consultation?

Following the consultation process a public report will be produced, the design proposals will be reviewed and, in consultation with Transport for London and taking into account your views, the Council will reach a decision on how to move forward with the A105 scheme by the end of this year. Following this, construction is anticipated to start in spring 2016.
